Background and objectives

The conference is organized in the framework of project "Valorizing the Montenegrin Katuns through sustainable development of agriculture and tourism - KATUN"¹. The main idea of KATUN project, being implemented by the interdisciplinary research team, is to create a knowledge base for the multipurpose use of the Montenegrin mountain resources, by combining the traditional agriculture with boosting tourism activities and protecting the cultural heritage (www.katun.me).

Katuns as nuclei of traditional agriculture in mountain areas face many challenges. This uniqueness of Montenegro has to be preserved and revitalized via new opportunities in tourism and other complementary activities (handcraft, trade, culture, services).

The Conference objective is to provide an overview of different experiences and good practices in development of mountain areas, to improve understanding of the challenges in dynamic social and economic environment and to bring together key players in development of Montenegrin mountains.

As an important milestone of the project, the Conference is expected to contribute in achieving the main project aims: knowledge and innovations' transfer to the agriculture and agro-tourism; generate entrepreneurship in the mountainous multifunctional agriculture; and achieve sustainable cultural heritage protection.

Target audience

This conference is intended for researchers and the professionals involved in different aspects of development of rural areas (producers, food chain representatives, public stakeholders and agencies, policy makers, consulting sector, NGOs,...), as well as those dealing with tourism and cultural-historical heritage there.

The main thematic areas

The conference will be focused on the social, cultural and business environment in sustainable development of mountain areas, specifically on:

- Social innovations and entrepreneurship in rural development
- Sustainable agricultural production in mountainous areas, especially on katuns
- Promotion and protection of the traditional products
- Ecological system services in mountainous areas, environment and biodiversity protection
- Sustainable eco-rural tourism
- Cultural-historical heritage: story, material, the perspectives

Round table on ideas and recommendations for further development of the katuns will be organized at the end of the program.

Conference languages

The official conference languages are English and Montenegrin.

Abstracts

Abstracts are required in English. The abstract should contain the specific objectives, experimental methods and statistical analyses used, together with a synthesis of the results and conclusions. The title, authors and the abstract must not exceed 2.500 characters (including spaces). Instructions for writing abstracts are available at: [link](#)

The Conference publications

Papers will be presented orally and in a poster session.

Abstracts will be published in the book of abstracts prior to conference. All the papers will be peer reviewed before publishing. Accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings only if at least one of the authors is officially registered and the paper presented. Conference Proceedings will be published as edition of the Montenegrin Academy of Science and Art (CANU).

Instructions to authors:

The article should be written in either: English or Montenegrin language or in some of the languages which are in official use in Montenegro (Serbian, Bosnian, Albanian and Croatian), in Cyrillic or Latin alphabet. Each article at the beginning should include the title, the names of the authors and the abstract while the literature and the authors' affiliations (including e-mail addresses) should be placed at the end of the article.

The authors should prepare the article in LaTeX or MS Word format. It is recommended to use 11pt font for the letters and B5 format for the pages. The pages (without header and footer) should be the width of 13 cm and the height of 19 cm. The article should not exceed 25 pages including the graphics.

In case of acceptance, after reviewing process, the author will be asked to send the original latex or word source of the article adapted according to the instructions that will be sent to the author. In addition, the title and the abstract of the article, both written in English, should be sent separately.
